<u>City Receives Alliant Energy Trees Forever Grant:</u> Alliant Energy awarded the City of West Branch a \$5,289 tree project grant from the Branching Out partnership with Trees Forever. Thanks to Public Works Director Matt Goodale for writing this successful grant application. Trees will be planted in Beranek Park sometime this spring. We are hopeful to receive trees in time for Earth Day.

<u>Iowa Stormwater Education Partnership (ISWEP):</u> ISWEP provided the following update to members in their February newsletter: "Welcome to ISWEP 2.016 where everything is staying the same except for our name and even that is almost the same where we went from Iowa Stormwater Education **Program** to Iowa Stormwater Education **Partnership.** ISWEP is a member-driven organization working in partnership with one another to protect and improve local water quality while dealing with challenges of state and federal stormwater permit requirements. We will continue the educational program, training and contracted services as we have been for the past 10 years.

With the organizational change, 11-members volunteered to be on an ISWEP Board of Directors. Moving forward there will be committees formed which will require member involvement. One of the first board decisions was hiring Pat Sauer as ISWEP's first Executive Director as well as contracting with Stacie Johnson as Eastern Iowa program coordinator.

On a national level – a National Municipal Stormwater Association is forming as a new nonprofit to represent MS4s with issues related to federal stormwater permit requirements. Two committees of interest with the National Municipal Stormwater Association include one who will meet with EPA on a regular basis to address MS-4 concerns on proposed stormwater regulatory requirements and another will meet to address a national educational campaign. ISWEP has been involved with organizational development meetings and the 2016 budget included membership dues to support the National organization.

On a state level – time is running out to submit nominations for the 2016 Stormwater Award presented at the Iowa Water Conference in March as well as the photo contest. There is a post conference workshop on March 24 for those working to bring about social change through Education and Outreach. The workshop immediately follows a conference session, which introduces concepts presented more in-depth during the post-conference workshop. We look forward to seeing you in Ames in March."

**Lynch Heights Subdivision:** The Planning and Zoning Commission voted to recommend rezoning and acceptance of the Lynch Heights Subdivision preliminary plat with stipulations that stormwater, park space and pedestrian crossing issues are resolved with city staff before this development is presented to the City Council.

<u>Public Safety Update:</u> West Branch officers attended a training that included CPR, operation of AED's and Blood Bourne pathogens provided by the West Branch Fire Department earlier this month. As mentioned at the February 16<sup>th</sup> Special City Council Meeting, Fire Chief Kevin Stoolman, Police Chief Mike Horihan and several West Branch Fire Fighters attended Pipeline Emergency Preparedness Training in Coralville sponsored by the Iowa Pipeline Association on February 11<sup>th</sup>.

On February 15<sup>th</sup>, Officer Cathy Steen, Chief Mike Horihan and West Branch Community School District Counselor Carolyn Colbow gave a presentation on social media to all west Branch Middle Students. The class taught students about what is appropriate and what is inappropriate when it comes to texting. Officers provided four, 50-minute programs. The Police Department also made available a class offered to parents later in the day.

Next week, West Branch Police Department officers will attend a three-hour Defensive Tactics Training in Mechanicsville, instructed by Iowa Law Enforcement Instructors. There will also be an after-action review of the response to several automobile crashes that blocked the west bound lanes of I-80 on Valentine's Day. Both Police and Fire did an excellent job in responding to this incident. Representatives from the Iowa Department of Transportation, Cedar County EMA, the Iowa State Patrol and other local agencies are also expect to attend this after-action review.

<u>Public Works Update:</u> With the lack of any significant winter storms, Public Works staff has spent the majority of this winter on organizing, cleaning and maintenance at the Public Works Shop. Nearly all of the mowers, trimmers, chainsaws, generators and vehicles have been serviced to be made ready for the fast approaching construction/mowing season. Public Works has also spent a fair amount of time this winter trimming trees in the parks, cemetery and along the Hoover Trail. Several trees were also removed completely due to safety concerns. Staff has also attended several storm water classes, water and wastewater classes and safety classes, as well as participating in online safety classes available through the Iowa Municipal Workers Compensation Association (IMWCA). Staff recently graded and placed gravel on several alleys in town that were in need of repair and on the parking lot at the Public Works Shop.

<u>Summer League Registration Now Available:</u> The West Branch Park & Recreation Department is now accepting registrations for Summer League. Please see the attached February Park & Recreation Newsletter for more information.

<u>Library Update:</u> The West Branch Public Library has several events occurring with the end of the month. First, the library has another Family Movie Night this Saturday, February 27th at 7pm. The movie is one picked for the whole family with details provided on the library's website at <u>wbpl.org</u>. There are also two events ending with the end of February. The library's community survey is still available at <u>wbpl.org/survey2016</u> through the end of the month. The more responses received, the better the library can create upcoming plans, so we hope that everyone will take a couple of minutes to complete one. Also, the Winter Adult Reading Month wraps up at the end of February so there is still time to register, finish books, and return your records for a chance to win prizes!
